

Needle Options: Choosing the Correct One

Making an appropriate needle selection for your embroidery tasks is a vital part of a quality embroidery operation. The correct needle can mean the difference between sharp, crisp stitching and lumpy, frayed designs. The right needle also prevents thread and needle breakage. Fabric, thread type and design sizes will determine which needle to use.

Madeira offers a large selection of large eye needles. This style accommodates a wider range of thread sizes without increasing the thickness of the needle. Your embroidery machine can run faster with fewer thread breaks and easier needle threading.

'SFT' = Sharp Flat Point
